EXECUTIVE SUMMARY

This document represents the third and final iteration of the Report on the Cluster Community Group’s feedback on PEERS, its activities and ecosystem. It builds on the findings of the previous iteration, D6.9, which captured feedback gathered between January 2024 and January 2025, and now reflects the improvements made to the ecosystem based on this feedback, as well as the final insights collected from February to October 2025, marking the completion of the project’s consultation and co-creation process.

Throughout its implementation, the PEERS project continuously evolved through feedback from its stakeholders, which included CBRNe practitioners, policymakers, researchers, and representatives from standardisation bodies. These exchanges were crucial in shaping the project’s tools and legacy strategy, particularly the CBRNe Knowledge Hub and the Virtual Reality (VR) assets, ensuring that they met the operational and strategic needs of the EU CBRNe community.

During Year 3, the CBRNe Knowledge Hub evolved from its Beta to its Gamma version, featuring major enhancements in usability, data quality, accessibility, and security. It now offers a stable, fully operational environment that supports CBRNe practitioners, policymakers, and researchers in situational awareness, knowledge management, training, and collaboration. The integration of VR tools into the Hub further strengthened its training dimension, providing immersive, evidence-based learning experiences validated by operational users.

All consultations and feedback collected during this final phase also informed the development of a comprehensive exploitation and sustainability strategy (as outlined in D6.8), designed to ensure long-term uptake and visibility of the project’s key exploitable results (KERs). Central to this approach is the continued engagement of relevant networks of professionals and projects, whose collaboration will maintain momentum and foster cross-project synergies.
