



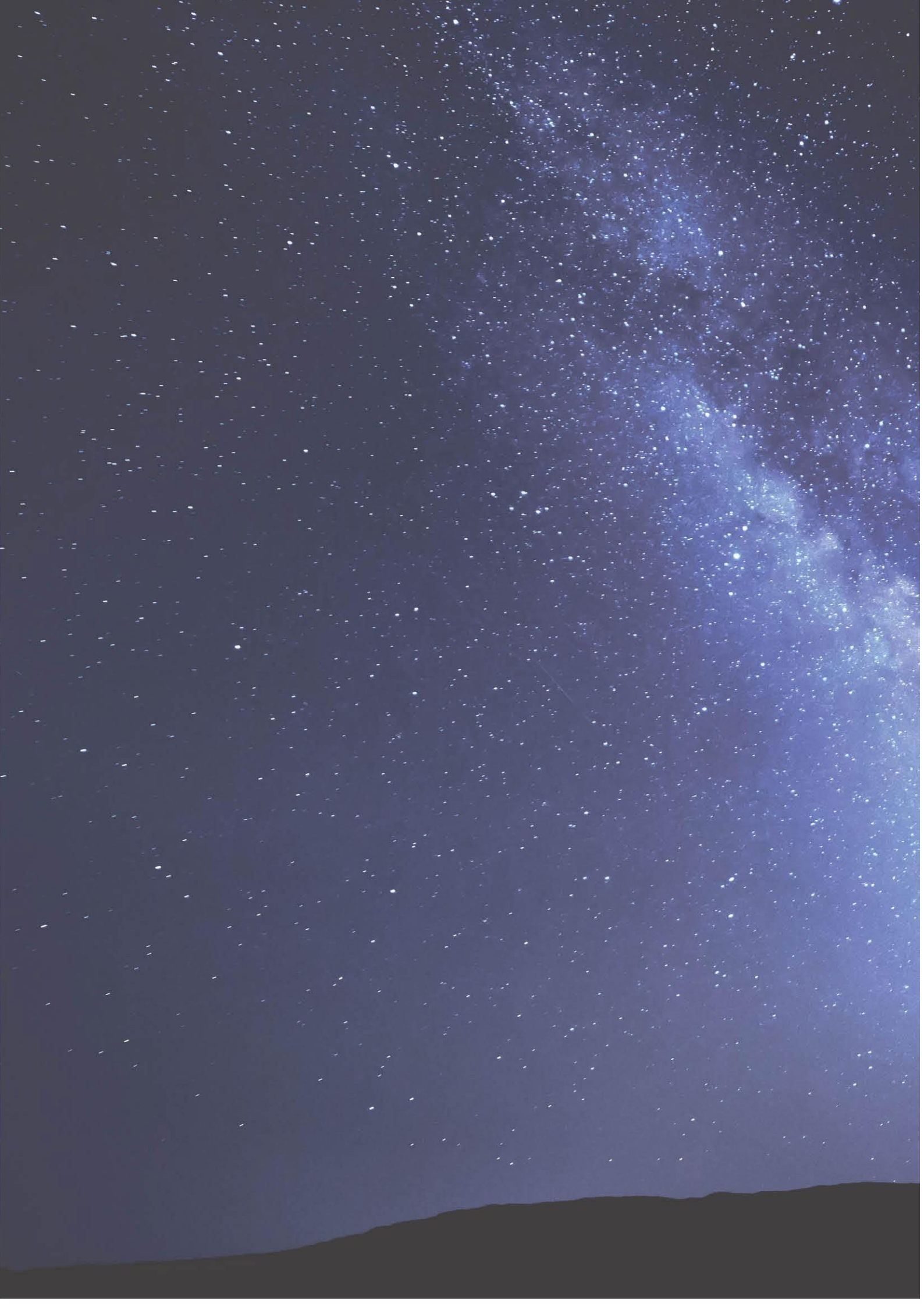

EXECUTIVE SUMMARY

This Deliverable, D6.5, 'PEERS Better Practice/Standardisation Roadmap', acknowledges the contribution of the European Commission in support of the Better Practice Guide initiative resulting from the NO-FEAR project. The initiative aims to demonstrate an alternative mechanism for pre-standardisation and the needs of related activities.

In PEERS, the focus was on enhancing our understanding of the CBRNe field in the context of delivering a Better Practice Guide (BPG) pre-/standardisation roadmap.
